Annual Permit	\$5
Batteries (automotive and rechargeable only)	No charge
Bulky (non-metal)	<i>Businesses/Non-Profits:</i> 7.5¢/lb <i>Residents:</i> First ten items each year are free (maximum of two trips); 7.5¢/lb thereafter
Construction & Demolition Debris/Trash	7.5¢/lb
Electronics	7.5¢/lb, PLUS \$5 per TV or monitor
Fire Extinguishers	\$5 each
Fluorescent Lamps and Ballasts	\$1 each
Mercury Thermostats	No charge
Metal Scrap (including appliances)	No charge
Oil (automotive and cooking)	No charge
Propane Tanks (maximum of 60 lbs)	\$1 each for 1 lb tanks; \$5 each for all other sizes
Recyclables	No charge
Tires	<i>Automotive:</i> For vehicles currently registered in Manchester, no charge for first four tires per vehicle per year; otherwise, \$5 each <i>Other types (from bicycles, mowers, etc.):</i> \$1 each
Yard Waste	7.5¢/lb (no charge for residential permit holders, December – March)

Guidelines

Annual Permits are required to use the facility, with limited exceptions. Customers who fail to follow facility rules may have their permits revoked. See reverse side for eligibility requirements and other information.

Asbestos is strictly prohibited.

Automated dump bodies may NOT be used, except to dispose of yard waste. See reverse side for explanation.

Bulky (non-metal) items are furniture, rugs, and— at the discretion of the Scale Operator— other items whose size or weight precludes standard curbside collection. Doors, kitchen and bathroom cabinetry, sinks and toilets are considered construction and demolition debris and are NOT treated as bulky items.

Electronics include, per NH State law: TVs, monitors, computers, and any device that has a video display greater than 4 inches diagonally or is capable of playing/recording analog or digital video.

Fill (i.e., soils and rocks) are NOT accepted.

Fluorescent Lamps must be in-tact. Broken lamps are NOT accepted.

Hazardous Wastes are NOT taken, except as follows: electronics, in-tact fluorescent lamps, and used oils. Additional household items are accepted during special collection events— see reverse side for more details.

Oil must be in containers of one gallon or less and free of contaminants such as water or gasoline.

Recyclables are paper and cardboard; tin; steel; aluminum; glass; and plastics #1, #2, #4, #5 and #7 (no PVC [#3] or polystyrene/"Styrofoam" [#6]). Paper and cardboard must be separated from the other materials.

Tires from automotive vehicles are eligible for free disposal only if customer provides a current Manchester vehicle registration (copies not accepted). Each set of four free tires requires a unique registration.

Yard Waste must be free of contaminants, such as litter and rocks. Compostable materials (leaves, pine needles, grass, etc.) must be separated from brush and logs. Stumps and large roots are NOT accepted.

*** Facility capacity is limited. Personnel are authorized to reject large loads of any material in the rare instance that the quantity and/or timing of disposal will unfairly prevent others from using the facility. ***

Am I eligible for a permit?

Only Manchester residents, Manchester businesses and outside contractors whose waste has been generated in Manchester are eligible for a permit. Permits are good for one year from the date of purchase.

Residents

Residential permits are issued to customers who present proof of Manchester residency. Following is sufficient:

- Current driver's license with a Manchester address OR
- Valid photo ID (driver's license or other) AND a utility bill or property tax bill or lease agreement for a Manchester address, dated within the past six months, showing the customer as a resident at the address listed on the document
- Any other proof that, at the sole discretion of the Scale Operator, verifies Manchester residency

Only one permit will be issued per household. Separate units at a single address constitute distinct households and each is eligible for its own permit. Only individuals RESIDING at the address that is the source of the waste may obtain a residential permit; landlords and property management companies must obtain a commercial permit (see below).

Manchester Businesses/Non-Profits

Commercial permits are issued to customers who present proof that they operate a business or non-profit organization (NPO) located in Manchester. Following is sufficient:

- Current City of Manchester business license OR
- Tax return from the past year showing a Manchester business/NPO name and address OR
- Utility bill, property tax statement or lease agreement dated within the past six months showing a Manchester business/NPO name and address OR
- Any other proof that, at the sole discretion of the Scale Operator, verifies that the business/NPO is located in Manchester

Outside Contractors Working in Manchester

Commercial permits are issued to contractors based outside of Manchester who are disposing of waste generated within Manchester and who present proof thereof. Following is sufficient:

- A recent contract or confirmation letter signed by the owner of a Manchester property OR
- Any other proof that, at the sole discretion of the Scale Operator, verifies that the waste to be disposed of was generated at a Manchester address

The City reserves the right to reject any waste from a permitted Manchester resident, business, NPO or outside contractor if the waste appears to have been generated outside of Manchester.

Which items do not require a permit?

Loads containing ONLY recyclables and/or automotive wastes from vehicles registered in Manchester do not require a permit. Administrative costs to process these items are covered by separate funding sources.

Why are there restrictions on the use of automated dump bodies?

The use of automated dump bodies increases the risk of: (1) hazardous materials and other contamination entering the facility's waste streams; and (2) waste containers being filled inadvertently beyond capacity. Restrictions on their use keep the facility's costs—and the fees required to cover those costs—to a minimum.

When Can I Dispose of Household Hazardous Wastes?

Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events are held at the Drop Off Facility on the second Saturdays of May and October, from 9 AM to 2 PM. These events are open to Manchester residents only. A facility permit is not required, but participants must bring proof of residency. Disposal is free. Limitations apply. Please visit www.manchesternh.gov/HHW for more information.
