

Asthma is a chronic disease that often requires daily attention. Our Asthma Peer Educators are trained by a Registered Nurse to assist families in understanding how to manage their child's asthma, their child's asthma medications, and how the environment can effect asthma. Most importantly, the Asthma Peer Educators can help you to get your child's asthma under control.

## Why should I sign-up for this FREE program?



An Asthma Peer Educator will come to your home at a convenient time, and develop a plan with you and your child on how to improve their asthma.

- We will teach you about your child's medicines.
- We will talk about asthma action plans, and how they can help your child's asthma.
- We will identify common asthma triggers in your home.

We will provide you with the items you need to help get your child's asthma under control, such as mattress and pillow case covers, a peak flow meter, and/or allergen-free cleaning supplies.



## How do I sign-up?

## It's easy!

Just talk to your child's school nurse. They will ask you to sign a release of information form, and they will send it to our Program Manager at the Manchester Health Department *OR* call the Manchester Health Department and ask to speak with the Asthma Program Manager.



We will also work closely with your child's doctor and school nurse.
