
Fiscal Year Statistics:

Children's Services:



The Manchester City Library had a changing of the guard this fiscal year as long time Head of Children's Services Kathy Urie retired and Karyn Isleb joined the staff from Wisconsin.

Children's services continue to include our popular story-times, the annual teddy bear picnic and the Halloween parade. The Children's room circulated 113,818 items this past year.

Reference Services:



The Information Services division provides quality assistance to our patrons for all types of informational needs. Our Information Services staff answered 69,132 questions in Fiscal Year 2007. This division also helps to select our online databases available 24 hours a day via our website as well as selecting new library books for circulation. The Library also provides information on New Hampshire history and has genealogical records



in our New Hampshire Room. This collection has been utilized by users from all over the world.

Technical Services:

This behind the scenes division added over 13,000 items for both library locations. Technical Services maintains the library's 246,000 volume collection between the



main library and our branch. This division oversees the content of the online catalog ensuring our users can locate what they are looking for.

Circulation Services:

The Circulation Department oversees the



checking in and out of library materials. We average a turnover of approximately 60,000 items a month.

Circulation also makes sure that library materials are returned to their proper locations and assist patrons with Home Services for those who cannot travel to the libraries.



Automation Services:

The Manchester City Library Department provides over 40 computers for

the public to use for various research needs. Our automation division maintains all the library equipment from our computers to our copiers and microfilm reader printers. This division helps to keep our web-site up to date as well as providing computer instruction to the public in a classroom format. This division was instrumental in helping us write a successful Samuel Hunt grant to install Wi-Fi access in both library buildings which will go live in the summer of 2007.



Branch Services:

The West Manchester Community Library (a.k.a. our West Branch) provides a selection of popular materials,

basic research resources and computers for citizens on the city's west side. Children's services as well as family programming are also a focus of the West Branch. A fiber optic connection was installed at the Branch this past Fall which brought stability to our computer connections. Renovation work was to begin in the summer of 2007 to repair the roof and chimneys to address leaks and we look forward to the completion of that project in Fiscal Year 2008.

Library Programs

In Fiscal Year 2007 the library staff sponsored over 300 programs between both buildings for library users. We had over 16,000 attendees. Below is a list of programs offered:
