

BOARD OF REGISTRARS

January 20, 2004

Chairman McHugh called the meeting to order.

The Clerk called the roll.

Chairman McHugh addressed item 3 of the agenda:

Acceptance of voter checklist (additions, deletions and changes) from
October 26, 2003 to January 20, 2004.

On motion of Ms. Krasner, duly seconded by Ms. Arnold it was voted to accept the additions, deletions and changes to the voter checklist from October 26, 2003 through January 20, 2004. There being none opposed the motion carried.

Chairman McHugh addressed item 4 of the agenda:

Copy of a communication dated December 17, 2003 forwarded to 1165
Manchester residents relative to their official residence, those not having
responded to be removed from the checklist.

Deputy Clerk Piecuch explained that the Board had authorized the City Clerk's Office to send out letters to those voters whose residency needed to be verified due to mail that was returned to the office as well as other notifications the office had received. She handed out a listing of individuals who received the letters noting that the list reflected ones that had already been deleted as the office had received the mail returned by the Post Office, others that had responded and will remain on the list and others there were no response. She noted that the ones that were deleted prior to the meeting were already included in the report, so she asked for a motion to accept the responses received and to delete those that did not respond. She noted to the Board that even though the individuals had been or were going to be deleted that they would be able to register on Election Day as new voters.

On motion of Ms. Arnold, duly seconded by Ms. Krasner, it was voted to accept the responses received and to allow the City Clerk's Office to delete those that had not responded back to the letter. There being none opposed, the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Deputy Clerk Piecuch updated the Board on the upcoming Presidential Primary stating that the City Clerk's Office was prepared in covering all wards with Deputy Registrars and that we were looking to register upwards of 2000 voters. She also informed the Board that this was a party primary so undeclared voters were going to be reverting back to their undeclared status after voting. She also noted that some individuals would not revert back, so those individuals would need to have their parties changed reflecting the ballot that they were given at the polls.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Registrars, on motion of Ms. Arnold, duly seconded by Ms. Pepino, it was voted to adjourn.
