What Is A Pay & Display Meter?

Pay & Display Meters are automated parking meters which replace multiple parking meters on a block. All customers parking on that block pay the meter and display the payment receipt on the vehicle's dashboard

How Do I Find The Meter?

Look for these new signs, which will direct you to the nearest meter.



How Do I Use The Meter?

It's as simple as 1, 2, 3! Look for these placards on the face of each meter.

Can I Use Credit Cards?

Yes. All Pay & Display Meters accept coin and credit cards, but there is a minimum credit card purchase of \$1.00 or 2 hours.

What If I Paid For More Time Than I Need?

Pay & Display Meter receipts can be used at ANY city meter. If you paid for 2 hours but only park for 30 minutes, you can drive to any other meter and park while the receipt is still valid. The time limit restrictions still apply, though, so don't stay in any space longer than the posted time limit.

Will Parking Spaces Be Striped?

No, the parking space pavement markings for parallel parking downtown will be erased. This will allow vehicles to park closer together and will create more parking for the city. The diagonal parking lines will remain.

Does it Cost More To Park At A Pay & Display Meter?

No, it's still going to cost 50¢ per hour. Remember that credit card purchases will have a minimum of 2 hours, or \$1.00.

What Are The Benefits To The Public?

- Convenience of credit card payments
- Customers receive a receipt and are able to take their remaining parking time with them to any city meter
- More parking due to the removal of lines
- No more meter posts - frees up sidewalk space for pedestrians
- Pay & Display meters are more reliable
- More revenue for the city, which helps keep tax rates down

What Is Going To Happen To The Old Meters?

The old meters can be purchased for \$15.00 each at our offices on 480 Hayward Street.

What Happens If A Meter Doesn't Work?

You can purchase time from a nearby unit. Meters communicate with parking division employees if there is a problem. A malfunctioning coin or card slot will automatically close, preventing customers from paying if a receipt cannot be issued.

Will I Get A Ticket While Paying The Meter?

No, all of the meters are within view of the parking areas, and our parking control officers know to look for you before issuing a ticket.

How Will Parking Spaces Be Reserved For Construction Activities?

Currently, the city rents meter hoods at a cost of \$15.00 each per day. For the Pay & Display Meters, a parking pass can be purchased from the parking division for commercial use only. Renters will be responsible for reserving their spaces.

What If I Have A Motorcycle?

Motorcycle riders still need to pay the meter and display the receipt on the console under the windshield. Other cities have not had theft problems, but if you pay with a credit card, we can track the transaction and void the ticket.
