


STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE LANDFILL BAN ON TELEVISIONS AND COMPUTER MONITORS

As of July 1, 2007, the City of Manchester Refuse Division will no longer collect TVs and computer monitors at the curb. Residents will be required to bring these items to the Drop-Off for free disposal.



Beginning on July 1, 2007, the State Legislature (House Bill 1455) has banned all video display devices greater than 4-inches diagonally, including televisions, liquid crystal displays, plasma displays, and computer monitors (contain 4 - 8 pounds of lead) from disposal in New Hampshire landfills and incinerators.



The City of Manchester is offering a free disposal option for these video display devices, as well as other computer peripherals including computers, printers, fax machines, scanners, keyboards, etc. All electronics will be demanufactured and recycled.



The Drop-Off is also accepting other small electronics (anything with a cord) including toasters, radios, phones, stereo systems, etc, for free disposal.

The Drop-Off, located at 500 Dunbarton Road on the City's West Side, is open Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 3:00 PM, and the first and third Saturdays of the month from 7:00 – 11:30 AM.
