Partners for Peace Young Rescuers Is Now Accepting Applications For Youth Participation at Annual International 2010 Youth Rally in the Republic of Belarus

Manchester, NH, April, 2010 — The *Partners for Peace Young Rescuers* program is currently accepting applications for participation in the International Rally of Young Rescuers program hosted annually by the Republic of Belarus. This program is available to youths from New Hampshire between the ages of 14 to 17. The International Youth Rally will be held September 15th – 23rd of 2010. Full and partial scholarships to this program are available on a limited and competitive basis. The USA sent a team, mostly comprised of NH youths, to Belarus in 2008, and again in 2009. In addition to being hosted by Belarus, it is officially sponsored by the UNICEF with more than 15 nations participating including Germany, Moldova, Switzerland, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Russia, Bulgaria, Romania, Ukraine and Azerbaijan.

"The Partners for Peace Young Rescuers program is proud to participate in this international youth rally hosted annually by the Republic of Belarus. Young Rescuers learn and compete in basic life safety competitions, enjoy excursions to cultural, scenic, and historic sites throughout Belarus and make lasting international friendships," stated former Ambassador George Bruno.


