

I am writing to see if you would approve the Alzheimer's Association to host the Walk to End Alzheimer's at Arms Park in Manchester on Saturday, September 22<sup>th</sup>. The Walk to End Alzheimer's is the Alzheimer's Association's largest fundraising and public awareness event and this fall we expect over 1,500 attendants to participate in our efforts in Manchester. This will be our 5<sup>th</sup> year hosting the Walk in downtown Manchester and we are looking forward to continued success.

The walk route includes a 5, 3 and 1 miles walk through downtown via Elm Street. I have included copies of the route plan from our 2011 walk for you to review. We have worked with the Manchester Police Department to ensure safety on the route and will continue to do so going forward.




# Walk to End Alzheimer's Central New Hampshire, Manchester NH



### 5 - mile walk



At the direction of the Public Safety, Health & Traffic Committee, Deputy City Solicitor Thomas Arnold, III and I met to discuss the issue of driveway visual obstruction. I believe that the following amended Zoning Ordinance language reflects the directive of the committee.

Amend Section 10.09 Limited use of yard areas for parking, Subsection 10.09 (B) (2) as follows:

2. Front yard. The location of required parking spaces may be within a driveway located in the front yard, provided that not more than one space containing a vehicle of less than 4' in height is located within the required minimum front yard setback;

#### [Added language in bold italic]

While this amendment to the Zoning Ordinance would have the effect of limiting the height of vehicles located in driveways created after its adoption, Deputy Solicitor Arnold confirms that pre-existing driveways will enjoy "grandfathered" status and be permitted to continue use as the ordinance currently allows. In addition to its limited effect, I would also point out that the ability to enforce such an ordinance requirement will be very difficult. Due to the transient nature of vehicles it will be difficult for the department's inspectors to document violations. For these reasons I do not feel that it would serve the City well to adopt such a change.

We will of course process any amendment to our ordinances as deemed appropriate by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen. If the proposed change is found to be suitable to the committee, I would recommend that it be forwarded to the Administration Committee as would be standard practice.

#### Dear Mayor Gatsas:

We have been referred to you, and to our first district representative "Joyce Craig", by Officer Mark Ampuja of the Manchester, Police Department for your possible help in trying to obtain through proper city ordinances, some "Handicapped Parking Signs" which might to be erected in front of our home on 37 Everett Street which would eliminate a serious public street access problem ,which currently exists for us in front of our own home on Everett Street for my wife Elizabeth ,who is walking handicapped and is therefore unable to walk great distances to access a parked vehicle.

Elizabeth and I have been Manchester permanent residents of our single family home located on 37 Everett Street, where we have owned, and lived in with our family for a period of well over 40 Years.

During the past several years, we have had the misfortune of having to face increased denial of public access to our own (front-yard public street parking) because it is being taken up by "transient tenants "who rent apartments in a former (one family home) located on 38 Everett Street , which was converted into "multiple family dwelling", by an absentee landlord who was somehow granted a city zoning variance (allowing multiple family use ) despite eighborhood objections ,and despite the fact that there was NO adequate parking space for the three (3) ,apartments ,allowed to be established there by this zoning variance. This house, (located directly across the street from us), is one of (2), two abutting family homes (one to rear, and one to the front ) now threatened with bank foreclosure on Everett Street.

The (Front) Multiple family home on 38 Everett St. has become a major problem for us as single family residents in this former ("One-Family District"), because the overflow from the changing tenants in the multiple family dwelling continuosly park their vehicles in a manner which blocks any "reasonable access to the front entrance of our own single family home. These "transients" constantly take up all (3)"Three", of the public parking spaces located directly in front of our home lines which consist of a full (100 Feet ) of deeded street frontage on 37 Everett Street where we are constantly denied any access to parking in front of our own home.

This was not a problem in the earlier years of our residence on Everett St. because our home was a party of a properly zoned "single family "home district, with courteous neighbors. We would be happy if we were able to reasonably access just a "Single parking space by virtue of a couple of " handicapped signs" erected directly in front of the stairs of our own home ,so that my wife Elizabeth, who is handicapped with surgiclly implanted prostheses on both of her hips, and on one knee could access our car and not be forced to struggle great distances, especially in shoveled out icy conditions in the wintertime to reach our car.

I am therefore requesting your help and direction in taking one of two actions, A) Requesting that the multiple family zone variance be withdrawn from 38 Everett Street, or B) That we be

granted permission to place a double "Handicapped Sign" directly in front of our home on 37 Everett Street to solve the access problem .

Please Review and Advise ,as you may see fit.
