Harriman Park  
was originally named East Side Park and was  
given to the city by Emma S. Richard on  
October 31, 1905.

The Park was renamed on May 2, 1922 in  
honor of Lt. Lynn H. Harriman. Lt. Harriman  
served in the 101st Infantry in World War I and  
died on May 1, 1918 after being mortally  
wounded in combat.

Lt. Harriman was awarded the French Croix de  
Guerre & the American Distinguished Service  
Cross for his bravery.

June 2016, the entire park was renovated with  
walking paths, flower beds and playground  
equipment .
