Juvenile Arrested

A sixteen-year-old juvenile Manchester student allegedly pointed an air soft gun out of a moving vehicle window earlier today, which prompted a secure campus mode for Manchester School of Technology, Jewett Street School and Southside Middle School.

A Manchester teacher alerted a school resource officer about a student with a gun. The teacher stated a male student was seated in the back seat of a vehicle while driving eastbound on Weston Road around 10:15 a.m. The teacher stated the student was with other unidentified people inside of the car before he lost sight of him while he and his class walked on the sidewalk of Weston Road.

The teacher returned to Memorial High School to alert the school resource officer. The student was eventually located inside of the school, but he was not armed with the air soft gun. However, an air soft gun was located in the trunk of a vehicle belonging to another student a short time later.

The student was taken into custody around 11:45 a.m. and transported to police headquarters. The charges are pending at this time, so I cannot confirm the charge(s).

Woman Arrested After Stabbing Another Female

A Queen City woman was charged with three counts of First Degree Assault after she allegedly stabbed another female on the west side of the city. Police responded to the area around 53 West Street at approximately 11:25 p.m. for a disturbance.

Officers arrived on scene and located a male subject securing a female on the ground in front of 53 West Street. Kaisle Raikes, 23 of Manchester, New Hampshire was the man holding on to arrested; Britteny Indoccio, 27 of Manchester, New Hampshire.

Raikes was sitting on the porch of 53 West Street with his girlfriend/victim; Aileen Arzola, 22 of Lynn, Massachusetts when Indoccio approached them and asked for a cigarette. Indoccio allegedly grew upset with them because they did not have a cigarette. Indoccio allegedly pulled out a steak knife and stabbed Arzola in the right forearm. Both subjects grabbed hold of Indoccio and the steak knife. However, Indoccio was able to fight them off while retrieving a second steak knife from her

sock. She stabbed Arzola two more times. She was stabbed in the thigh and shin before Raikes pinned her to the ground.

Police arrived on scene and placed her into custody and the victim was treated at a local hospital for non-life threatening injuries. Indoccio was charged with Three Counts First Degree Assault. She will appear in the 9th Circuit Court-Manchester on June 2, 2016.

Barricaded Subject Arrested by SWAT Team

Manchester Police were alerted to an address at approximately 10:50 a.m. yesterday for a despondent individual who had made threats against the building manager and first responders. The building manager arrived at 24 Krakow Avenue to seek assistance for arrested; Patrick Clark, 35-years-of-age.

Clark's mother grew concerned for her son, so she contacted the property manager to conduct a wellness check. The property manager spoke with Clark through the window but noticed Clark was speaking incoherently and appeared to be under the influence.

Clark allegedly threatened to harm the property manager, as well as first responders if they attempted to enter his apartment. The manager, Richard Exline, 50-years –of-age, backed away from the building and contacted Manchester Fire Department, who in turn contacted our agency.

An element of on-duty SWAT personnel arrived on scene with the Bearcat and made contact with Clark. He made repeated threats toward law enforcement as they attempted to get him out of the apartment. Clark eventually exited the home due to the deployment of tear gas. He was taken into custody and transported to police headquarters.

He was charged with; Criminal Threatening (F), Criminal Threatening (M) and Resisting Arrest/Detention. He will appear in the 9th Circuit Court-Manchester on June 2, 2016.
