Armed Robbery Reported

Manchester Police responded to 117 Queen City Avenue (Seven Eleven) for an armed robbery on June 19, at 3:50 a.m. Officers spoke with the victim, Debra Root, 48 of Manchester, New Hampshire.

Root stated a lone individual walked into the store while brandishing a handgun. He pointed the gun in her direction as he ordered Root to retrieve cash from the register. She opened the register and handed him a stack of one dollar bills. The suspect allegedly reached into the cash drawer and removed five and ten dollar bills before fleeing on foot.

He was last seen running toward the west side of the store. She described him as a Caucasian male, approximately 5'08 and 180 lbs. with short, dark hair. He was last seen wearing a bandana over his face, a gray shirt and jeans.

laceration. He attempted to walk past her to avoid additional injuries. However, he was stabbed a second time as he ran past her in the narrow area. The second stabbing stuck him in his lower back.

Both wounds were consistent with slash marks and required on scene medical treatment. The victim refused additional medical treatment and remained on scene after Then was placed into custody for two counts first degree assault.
